 Discussion and Approval of an Ordinance Prohibiting the Drilling into and Extraction of Groundwater Within the Restricted Use Area. (901 Lafayette Avenue) (First Reading)

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MOUNDSVILLE, 1 WEST VIRGINIA, AMENDING AND RE-ENACTING SECTION 1381.21 OF 2 THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF MOUNDSVILLE TO PROVIDE 3 FOR RESTRICTED USE AREAS IN THE CITY OF MOUNDSVILLE FOR THE 4 PURPOSE OF PROHIBITING THE DRILLING INTO AND THE EXTRACTION 5 OF GROUNDWATER WITHIN THE RESTRICTED USE AREAS. (FIRST 6 7 **READING**) 8 Attorney White recommended council to table this ordinance until he can research it 9 further. 10 11 Councilperson Saunders made a motion to table until September 18 regular council 12 meeting, seconded by Councilperson Hunt. Motion carried unanimously. 13 14 Discussion and Approval to Consider Engineering the Old City Lot (North Jefferson 15 Avenue) and Highland Avenue at Rt. 250 to Center Street. 16 17 Councilperson DeWitt made a motion to approve engineering to the north city lot 18 between Jefferson Avenue and Baker Avenue, seconded by Vice Mayor Remke. Motion 19 carried unanimously. 20 21 Discussion and Approval to Survey the Property at the North/East Corner of Ruby 22 Street & Garfield Street for Proposed Half Basketball Court and Playground. 23 24 Councilperson DeWitt made a motion to have the property at Ruby Street & Garfield 25 Street surveyed, seconded by Councilperson Remke. Building Inspector 32 Richmond said the company installing the curbs have obtained their permits but not sure 33 if they submitted the B&O yet. Mr. Richmond said he will research the paving job. 34 35 \* Vice Mayor Remke asked for the status of 208 & 210 Washington Avenue? Building 36 Inspector Richmond said they are addressing those properties but he is not sure about the 37

\* Councilperson DeWitt asked if Fire Chief Brandon was able to speak with Sara Wood concerning a grant that provides funding to hire firefighters. Chief Brandon said he will contact her.
