The Council of the City of Moundsville met in Regular Session in the Council Chambers on April 16, 2019 at 7:00 p.m.
Meeting was called to order by Mayor Phil Remke who also gave the invocation.
City Clerk Hewitt called the roll and the following Councilpersons were in attendance: Dewitt, Vice Mayor David Wood, S. Wood and Mayor Remke. Absent: Haynes, Hunt and Saunders. Also present were City Manager Healy, Public Works Director Stocklask, Police Chief Mitchell, Fire Chief Brandon, Building Inspector Richmond, Parks & Recreation Director White, CPA Goddard Attorney White and City Clerk Hewitt.
MINUTES:
Regular Council Meeting of April 2, 2019.
Councilperson DeWitt moved to accept and approve the minutes of the regular council meeting of April 2, 2019, seconded by Councilperson S. Wood. Motion carried unanimously.
GENERAL PUBLIC HEARING:
* Carl Boso, 305 10 th Street, complained of burning on the Kudlak property and was upset the people burning did not get a citation. City Manager Healy said he spoke with Mr. Kudlak and Police Chief Mitchell concerning the incident.
* Joelle Mura, American Electric Power Spokesperson, who introduced herself to council members and offered her assistance to the City Manager and Council.
* Bev Reed, 98 5 th Street Bridgeport, opposes the proposed Cracker Plant in Belmont County and encourages council member to visit the plant in Pennsylvania. She announced meetings on April 27, 2019 at West Virginia Northern Community College from 10-4 and May 29, 2019 at the Moundsville Public Library from 6-7:30 p.m.

Vice Mayor Wood moved to approve the ordinance pertaining to policy provisions, seconded by Councilperson DeWitt.
Mayor Remke called for a voice vote. City Clerk Hewitt announced the following tally. 4 yeas. Motion carried unanimously.
Other Items to be Discussed by Council.
* Vice Mayor Wood asked Manager Healy when he plans to begin working on strategic planning for the city? Manager Healy said he has invited Bruce Decker to the May sub committee meeting to discuss strategic planning.
* Vice Mayor Wood suggested talking about the Roberts Rules of Order and coordinating them with city policy.
* Councilperson DeWitt asked for an update on the paving. Manager Healy will provide the update in his report.
* Councilperson S. Wood asked for the status of 34 or 36 Walnut Avenue & 50 Walnut Avenue. Manager Healy said the Building Inspector sent a letter to the owner of 50 Walnut Avenue and the other property has been taken care of.
* Councilperson S. Wood said she received a complaint of property at the dead end of Thorn Avenue near McNinch School. Manager Healy said Councilperson

Saunders also reported that property.

- * Councilperson S. Wood asked if Manager Healy received any guidance from the WVU Law Clinic concerning dilapidated houses owned by the state in the City of Moundsville? Manager Healy reported the WVU Law Clinic supplied a retainer agreement with the city which he provided to City Attorney White for his review. After signing the agreement we will be able to obtain input from them.
- * Councilperson S. Wood asked for the status of on the CMS Credit Card Service. City Manager Healy reported the idea has been placed on hold since the city is in the process of installing new software which has a combined credit card system.
- * Mayor Remke asked for an update on the Fostoria Bridge project. Manager Healy reported speaking with District Engineer David Brabham who advised the project is still in Charleston. Funding was a question, however, City Manager Healy reminded Mr. Brabham the City of Moundsville is responsible for 10% of the funding. Manager Healy noted he will be waiting to receive the agreement from DOH.
- * Mayor Remke asked for Manager Healy's thoughts on using Ms. Tina Morris as a grant writer for the city. Manager Healy reminded council that Belomar is available for any grants involving state or federal funding at no cost to the city. Other grants, such as foundation grants need to be submitted by somebody else. Council will need to be careful and decide what they would be willing to pay for a grant writer and how much information they will be willing to divulge to a grant writer.

* Mayor Remke moved to discuss at the finance meeting demolition of the Moundsville Police Department and finding a temporary facility for them. Motion failed for lack of a second.

* Vice Mayor D. Wood asked for an update concerning the Brick Layers Apprentice program and the Police Department building. Manager Healy reported the approval for the apprentices has not been finalized at this point. The agreement, when signed, will allow the work to be performed. There will be no charge to the city for labor only purchase of materials.

- 8 have all City projects completed by the end of May. The 2019 Street Paving
- 9 Priority List was distributed tonight.
- 3. The Stormwater Board completed work on South Highland last week, and
- installed three new catch basins installed on South Highland to try to keep all of
- the water off the street. Work on Jason Drive began today. Also, the Sanitary
- Board is having preliminary engineering work done to replace a main line from
- 14 12th Street to the plant, and have some plant upgrades completed.
- 4. The Water Board project along 4th Street hit a snag last week while they were
- digging at the gas station area, and discovered contaminated soil. The water line
- route will be changed slightly to avoid this. Also, the Board has decided to do the
- new line installation from Jefferson to Fostoria in house on an effort to reduce
- 19 project costs.
- 5. We had 27 people attend the Robert's Rules of Order class held last Monday.
- It was a very informative session, and hopefully was beneficial to all of the people
- that attended.
- 6. The first quarter of 2019 Municipal Sales Tax amounts have been released.
- The amount for this quarter is \$476,875.16.
- 7. The April Chamber of Commerce Business After Hours is this Thursday, April
- 18, at the Marshall County Co-Op. If you would like to attend, please call let

- 8. The Calvary United Methodist Church's Missions Committee is providing a
