Attorney White commented on the agreement from Municipal Court that she will continue to clean up the property and agree to weekly inspections by the Building Inspectors. If for any reason she defaults, she will be prosecuted by the city on both charges.

* Ask council to consider a hoarding ordinance due to the buildings at Third Street & Jefferson Avenue. Attorney White stressed that the City of Moundsville does not have a hoarding ordinance that citizens can have as much junk in their house as long as the structure of the building is solid.

Chief Clarke noted that Fire Prevention Week is going on. The Fire Department is very busy with annual inspections and any concerns dealing with city codes will be addressed.
