- 22 to traffic committee? Manager Healy said he was under the impression the request
- 23 was for a handicapped parking sign which we have a process for. However, the city
- 24 does not have a process for a veteran parking sign.
- * Mayor Hunt asked for an update on the bicycle program and software. Manager
- Healy reported the bicycles are being assembled by the gentleman providing the
- 27 maintenance for the bikes. Dave from Movatik said we are in the system but our
- software hasn't been set up yet. Once City Manager Healy sets that up he will make
