- 4 1. Update on the new Municipal Building we will be meeting with McKinley on
- 5 Thursday, September 17, to further review floor plans. At the last meeting we saw
- 6 two options and combined the best of both of those. We hope to see the results this
- 7 week.
- 8 2. At the Water Board Meeting last night, a lengthy discussion ensued after hearing

- will allow us to get these two properties demolished and out of the way.
