- 8 Invocation was given by Councilman K Mark Simms.

- Acting City Clerk Ankrom called roll and the following Councilpersons were in attendance: DeWitt, David Haynes, Paul Haynes, Remke, Simms, Wood, and Saunders.
- 12 Also present were Acting City Manager Hewitt, Police Chief Mitchell, Fire Chief Clarke,
- 13 Public Works Foreman Stocklask, Attorney White, CPA Goddard, and Acting Clerk
- 14 Ankrom. Absent was City Manager Hess (sick), Public Works Director Richmond, and
- 15 Inspector Schneider.

MINUTES:

Regular Council Meeting of May 6, 2014

- 19 Councilman Paul Haynes made a motion to accept the May 6, 2014 Regular meeting
- 20 minutes as presented, which Councilwoman DeWitt seconded, and the motion carried
- 21 unanimously.

GENERAL PUBLIC HEARING:

- * Ben Schillaci of 718 2nd Street complained about a neighbor obstructing traffic from traveling a public roadway. Curbs have been painted yellow to keep cars from parking
- near Mr. Rickrode's house, & a "No Thru Traffic" sign has been placed to keep vehicles
- 27 from driving through the alleyway. Acting Manager Hewitt had deed research done, and
- 28 the road is a through alley and not a private road.

* B J Schillaci of 713 2nd Street provided pictures of the before-mentioned signage and yellow curbs. He also disagrees with the particular resident being allowed to prevent traffic from using the alley.

- * H Carl Boso Jr of 305 10th Street asked Attorney White if he had researched laws
- 35 regarding buried shingles. Attorney White confirmed that burying "inert" material, on
- 36 your own property, is allowed as long as it contains no harmful chemicals. There are no
- 37 City ordinances pertaining to burying material on personal property. Attorney White gave
- 38 Mr. Boso contact information for the Department of Environmental Protection and Bureau
- 39 of Health. Mr. Boso also wanted to know why he received a 30-day notice from the
- 40 Building Inspector regarding 203 Parriott Avenue, which he recently purchased. Mr. Boso
- 41 believes there are other properties in worse condition, and he wants to make sure they are
- 42 addressed as well. Building Inspector Richmond maintains a list of properties that need

looked at, and Mr. Boso is free to review that list. Mr. Boso also discovered three vehicles

- 2 around his business were stickered by the Police Department. Chief Mitchell commented
- 3 he noticed the vehicles, which did not appear to have the proper registration.

- opining on the void at Theresa's Fabrics and the lack of compaction under the pavement.
- 25 There was also a water line break near the Moose Lodge. Concern was expressed about
- 26 the lack of inspection during the sewer line project and the ongoing gas company work.
- 27 Councilman Simms noted there have been void problems under Jefferson Avenue since
- 28 the StreetScape project that took place many years ago.

- 19 Commission for their assistance. A copy of the approved draft will be sent to Charleston.
