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The Council of the City of Moundsville met in Regular Session in the Council Chambers on July 6, 2021 at 6:00 p.m.

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Meeting was called to order by Vice Mayor Judy Hunt.

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9 Invocation by Councilman Randy Chamberlain.

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- 11 City Clerk Hewitt called the roll and the following Councilpersons were in
- attendance: Chamberlain, Vice Mayor Hunt, Saunders, Wallace, S. Wood and
- 13 Mayor David Wood (via Zoom). Absent: DeWitt. Also present were City
- 14 Manager Healy, City Clerk Hewitt, Finance Director Ankrom, Secretary Scarbin,
- 15 Chief Mitchell and Attorney White.

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17 **MINUTES:**

- 18 Regular Council Meeting of June 15, 2021.
- 19 Councilwoman S. Wood moved to approve the minutes of the regular council
- 20 meeting of June 15, 2021, seconded by Councilman Chamberlain. Motion carried
- 21 unanimously.

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GENERAL PUBLIC HEARING:

- 24 * Carl Boso, 305 10th Street, said he has his lot almost cleaned up but the Building
- 25 Inspectors have written him up twice because he is in the flood plain and needs
- licenses on vehicles on his lot. He also questioned why the Fire Department has
 - not received their equipment yet even though there has been money set aside for it.

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- * Jeremy Elson, 1401 Sixth Street, said his basement was flooded with sewage
- during this last storm. He has turned a claim into the Sanitary Boards Insurance.
- 31 He hopes the City can resolve issues residents are having with combined sewer
- 32 system. City Manager Healy invited Mr. Elson to the Sanitary Board meeting on
- July 19, 2021 at 5:30 p.m., where they will be discussing a resolution.

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CITY MANAGER ITEMS:

- **Appointment to the Moundsville Planning Commission.**
- 37 City Manager Healy received a letter from Jane Klug expressing an interest in
- 38 serving on the Moundsville Planning Commission. Manager Healy said he would
- appoint Ms. Klug for the 3 year term.

Personnel

- In the Parks & Recreation Department, one Desk Attendant resigned to enjoy retirement and one was hired maintaining our current staff at 6. Two lifeguards have resigned, and we hired 3 bringing our lifeguard total to 10. We are continuing to accept applications for both of these positions.
 - The full-time Street Department position was filled by Daniel Holmes, who will start on Monday, July 12th.

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1. The Pre-Bid for the building was held on June 22, with twenty general and subcontractors in attendance. The Bid Opening was decided to be delayed by one week due to the July 4th holiday, and will be held on Thursday, July 15th, at 1:30

- 2. This is a reminder of the \$250,000 CDBG COVID assistance grant that the city has received to assist residents with mortgage, rental, and/or utility costs that have
- 15 fallen behind as a result of COVID. Residents must meet income guidelines and
- 16 produce proper documentation. Applications are available at the City Building,
- 17 Four Seasons Pool, and on the website. Belomar Regional Council is handling the
- application intake and processing, and any questions can be directed to Natalie
- Hamilton of Belomar at 304-242-1800 or call the City Clerk's Office at 304-845-
- 20 3394. To date, Belomar has sent out over twenty applications, and received three
- 21 back completed.
- 22 3. Our website had 3,816 visits last month and 10,177 views. The most popular
- page was the online bill pay page, followed by the Four Seasons Pool page,
- 24 departments tab, and employment opportunities. Also, the app was downloaded 34
- 25 times in June, which brings the yearly total to 158.
- 4. The components for the Splash Pad were delivered late last week, and the
- 27 concrete will be started tomorrow. There is a delay in the electrical panel, but
- workers continue to work around these delays. Target for completion is now mid
- 29 to late July.
- 5. Tomorrow is the third Wander Out Wednesday of the season. I will allow
- 31 Councilperson Sara Wood to elaborate on this more, but plan to have lunch on
- 32 Jefferson Avenue tomorrow between 11-2.
- 6. David Lash of Cast & Baker Paving reported to me late this afternoon that
- Tomlinson, Morton, South Park, and McConnell Drive all have the base coat
- completed. Milling was started on Juniper, Pine, Mulberry, with Jackson next.
- 7. The first Business After Hours, sponsored by the Chamber of Commerce is
- 37 Thursday, July 22, from 5-7 at Grand Vue Park. Please contact Secretary Scarbin

- if you would like to attend. Also, the Expo is scheduled for August 13th and 14th.
- 2 It will kick off this year with a Business After Hours on August 12th.
- 3 8. The Recycling Center continues to see a good flow of residents. We had 31
- 4 vehicles through this past Saturday, of which 11 were first timers. The Family Pool
- 5 pass winner for June was the Crumm Family. We are doing another raffle this
- 6 month, with the winner drawn on July 31st. Recycling Coordinator Dave Bougher
- will be visiting the Wetzel County Drop-Off Program on July 24th.
- 8 9. Remember our small businesses and restaurants are our backbone. Keep
- 9 supporting them.

- something he and council can work on. Vice Mayor Hunt suggested including the
- Moundsville sign on Rt. 250 as well. Councilman Chamberlain asked for this item
- be placed on the traffic agenda.
